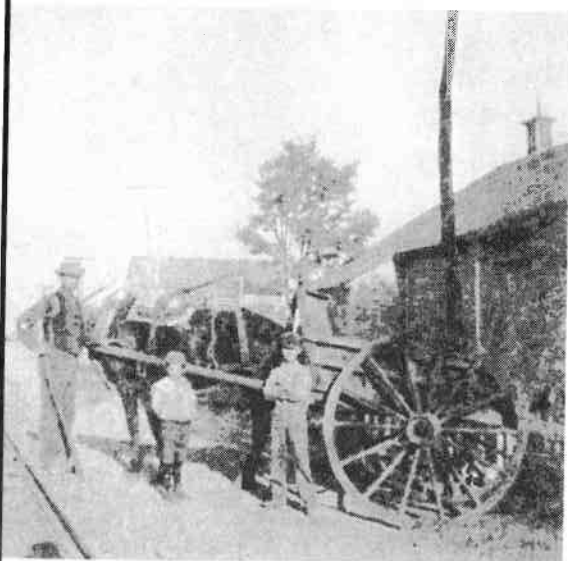


Lemoyne has changed throughout the past 100 years and it will change in the next 25 years. You can make it a better place to live, work and play.

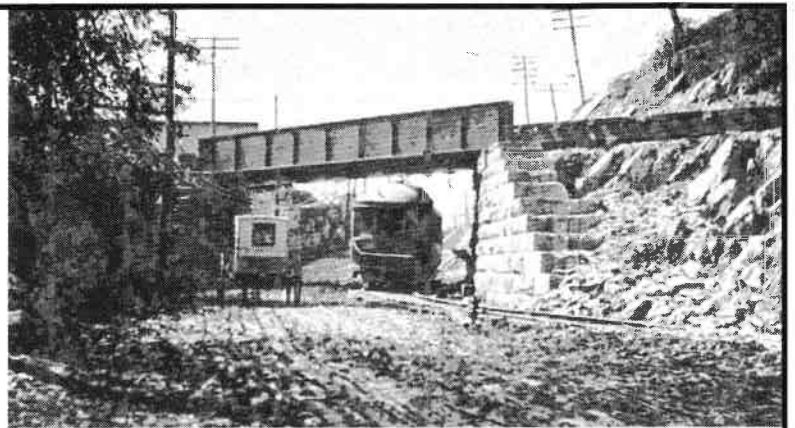

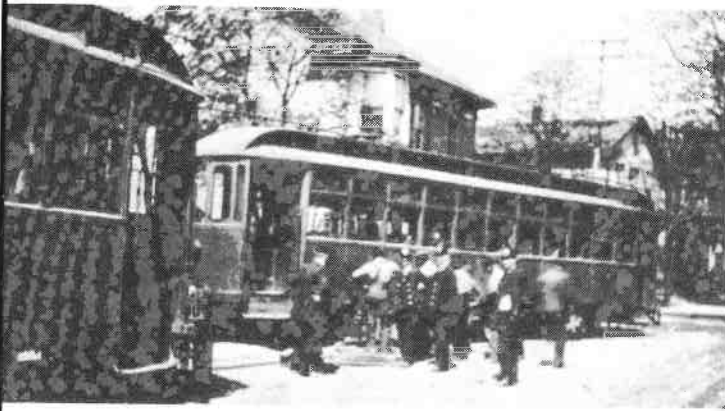

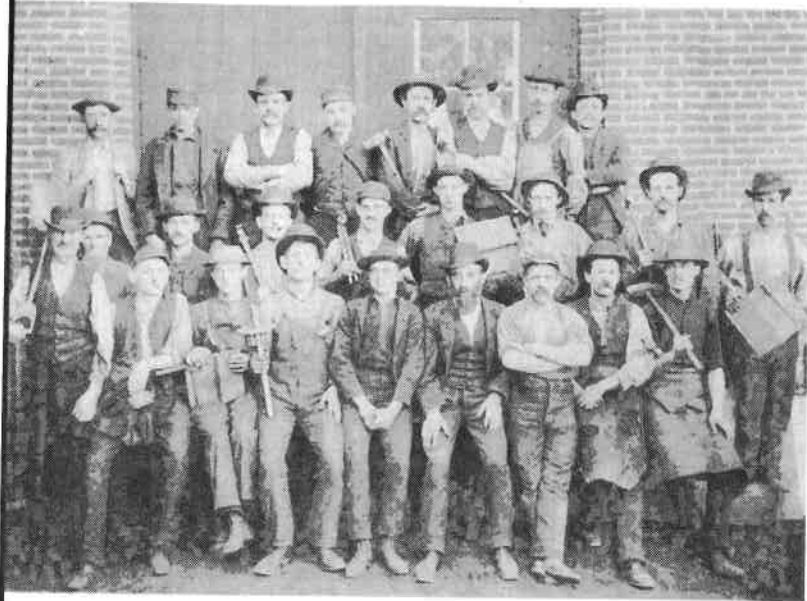
## LEMOYNE

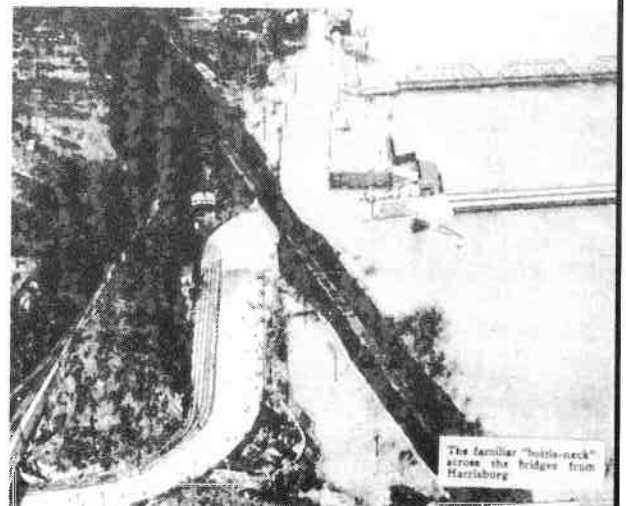

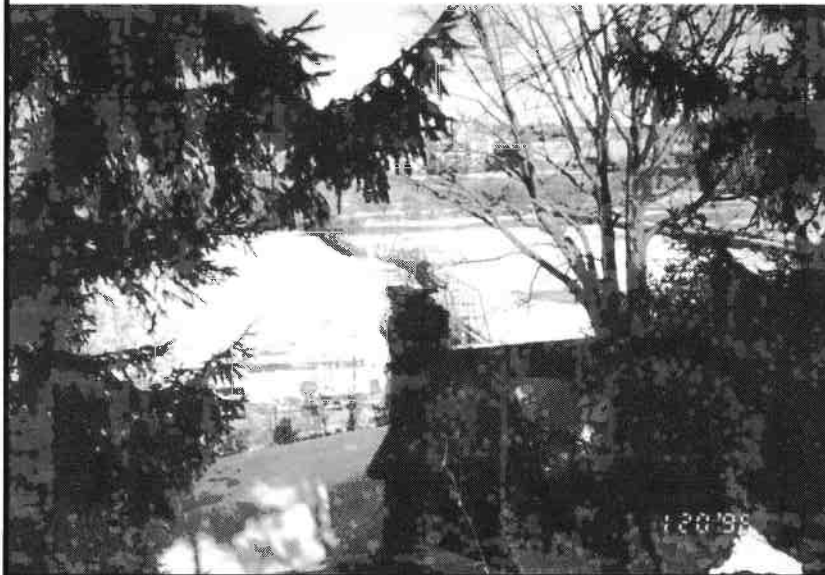

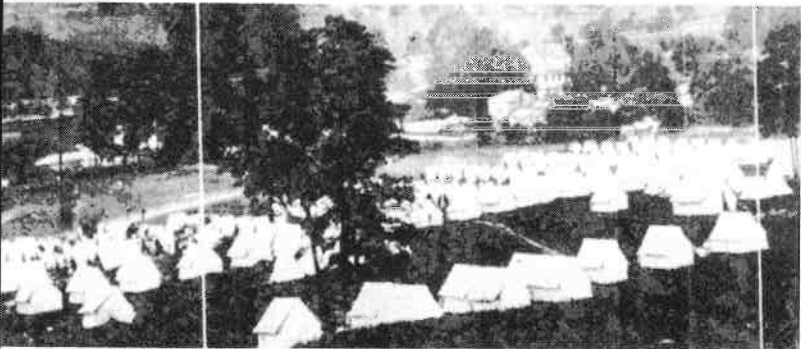
