From the Fire Chief:

2015 has started out to be an incredibly busy year for the West Shore Bureau of Fire. The department typically runs about 550 incidents per year and February is going to end with over 100 incidents. Unfortunately many of these were structure fires and vehicle accidents.

Another type of incident we have responded to on a regular basis this year is CO alarms.. Carbon monoxide, also known as CO, is a colorless, odorless, poisonous gas often formed in the process of incomplete combustion of organic substances, including fuels.

More than 150 people in the Unites States die every year and more become severely ill from accidental non fire-related CO poisoning. Consumer products that can cause CO include faulty, improperly-used or incorrectly-vented gas powered generators, fuel-burning appliances such as oil and gas furnaces, stoves, gas water heaters and fireplaces.

Because CO is odorless, colorless, and otherwise undetectable to the human senses, people may not know they are being exposed.

The initial symptoms of low to moderate CO poisoning are similar to the flu (but without the fever). They include:

- Headache, Fatigue, Shortness of breath, Nausea, and/or Dizziness

High level CO poisoning results in progressively more severe symptoms, including:

- Mental confusion, Vomiting, Loss of muscular coordination, Loss of consciousness, and can be fatal

Take the first steps in protecting your family from this odorless, colorless gas, Install and maintain CO detectors inside your home to provide an early warning. Make sure your furnaces and fireplaces are vented properly and serviced on a yearly basis.

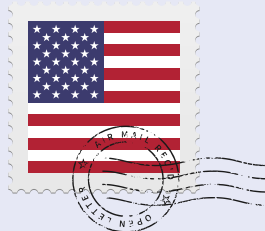

Spring is right around the corner and the Borough is encouraging all residents and businesses to take a look at the exterior of your properties for any areas that may need attention and a little sprucing up. First impressions of how your property looks are very important to all residents, businesses and visitors that enjoy our Borough.



During the Spring and Summer of 2015 our goal will be to conduct a visual inspection of all Borough properties. While conducting the inspection, if a violation is observed, a correction notice will be issued and placed on the door of the property. In December 2010, the Borough adopted using the 2009 International Property and Maintenance Code (IPMC) as an enforcement tool. You can view a copy of this and any other Borough ordinance at the Borough Office or online at www.lemoynepa.com.

In our visual inspections we will be focusing on multiple things that include:

- a. Sidewalks - All sidewalks, walkways, stairs, driveways, parking spaces, and similar areas shall be kept in a proper state of repair, and maintained free from hazardous conditions.
- b. Grass and Weeds - Unlawful for the owner of any premises to permit any weeds or similar vegetation, not edible or planted for some useful or ornamental purpose, to grow or remain upon any premises to exceed the height of 6 inches.
- c. Garbage and Rubbish – All exterior property and premises shall be free from any accumulation of rubbish or garbage.
- d. Abandoned and Junk Vehicles – No inoperable or unlicensed motor vehicle shall be parked, kept, or stored on any premises, and no vehicle shall at any time be in a state of major disassembly, disrepair, or in the process of being stripped or dismantled.

Many times residents forget that their garage also needs to remain in good condition and repair. We will also be looking at the condition of the exterior of your garage. The IPMC specifies that the exterior of a garage shall be maintained in good repair, structurally sound and sanitary so not to pose a threat to the

public health, safety, or welfare. We encourage you to include your garage area during your spring cleanup.

Please call or stop by the Borough Office with any questions or concerns. We look forward to working with you to beautify our community! 🌞

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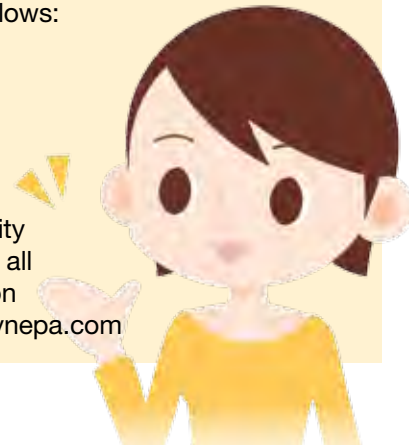
The Borough of Lemoyne has a beautiful Community Room available for rent.

Yard Waste Drop Off Begins

The Borough will have limited yard waste drop off beginning April 4, 2015. A volunteer will be on hand that day, and the 1st & 3rd Saturdays of each month from spring through fall, from 10:00 am until noon. Residents or landscape contractors, who can prove they are working for Borough property owners, can bring yard waste to the collection site near the wastewater treatment plant at the end of Lowther Street. Residents should bring something that shows their name and address. Contractors should bring a signed work order or paid receipt indicating the source of the waste. Stormwater runoff

**What is it? Why is it a problem?
What can you do to help?**

Rainfall, snowmelt, or irrigation water that runs off hard surfaces and across land or into pipes flows into streams and local waterways. This runoff can carry pollution that impacts stream quality and can increase flooding. In nature, water is usually absorbed into soil, soaked up by plants, and cleaned before entering waterways or recharging groundwater.



In urban and suburban areas, there are large amounts of impervious surfaces such as asphalt, concrete, rooftops, and compacted soils that prevent water from being absorbed by soil. As a result, water runs off rapidly into local waterways, leading to high flows and erosion. Litter, pet waste, fertilizers, pesticides, and oils are often carried to streams and left untreated.

These factors lead to unhealthy streams that are polluted, subject to flash flooding, are less valuable for recreation activities like swimming and fishing, and may be harmful to wildlife and people alike.

Green infrastructure and conservation landscaping aim to reintroduce natural processes into urban and suburban environments; using nature to improve water quality and reduce harmful flooding. Home and business owners can use these techniques to bring natural beauty to their property while being part of the solution to stormwater pollution.




Solutions to community runoff issues require the support and expertise of local planning officials. Addressing stormwater on your property is the first step, but a comprehensive approach is ideal. By learning about stormwater, you can help promote green infrastructure in your community. Contact your local municipality to encourage environmentally-friendly stormwater practices on public land.
