From the Borough Manager's Desk

Following are some reminders for our residents and property owners:

Snow Storms: As the weather gets colder and winter approaches our staff will be paying more attention to weather alerts for snow and ice storms. We are working on new procedures to work closely with the Mayor when it appears that a major storm is approaching and when to declare a "Snow Emergency". Once the Mayor makes that declaration we will use a public notification system called CODE RED. This system is designed to launch a recorded message to all land line telephones registered in the Borough. By going to the Borough web site (lemoynepa.com) and clicking on the sign up for CODE RED link, you can also have messages emailed to you and/or have text messages sent to your cell phone. We encourage all residents to sign up for this free service.



Speaking of Snow: This is to remind residents and property owners of their obligation to remove snow and ice from their sidewalks. Borough Ordinance No. 624 requires sidewalks to be cleared within 10 daylight hours after the snow and ice has ceased to fall. The cleared pathway must be at least 36 inches wide, and should not be thrown in the cartway of the street.

Electronics in Your Trash: Due to a state law that became effective in January 2013 our contracted waste hauler is not allowed to pick up electronic waste items such as desktop computers, laptops, monitors, and televisions. It is up to residents to take these items to a recycling location. Some large retailers such as Best Buy may take these items. The Dauphin County Recycling Center in Harrisburg at 1625 South Cameron Street will also accept your electronic waste. You can call them at 982-6772 to check their hours of operation and items they will accept for recycling.

Payment of Sewer Bills: Provided as a municipal service to a property, the payment of monthly public sewer service bills is a responsibility of the property owner. We do have a number of rental properties where the landlord and tenant have agreed that the tenant will pay the sewer bill. If this is the case, then the Borough requires that the owner get a duplicate bill mailed to them. The fee for this is \$6.00 per year, and is the best way for landlords to be assured that the tenant is paying the bill. If the tenant does not pay the bill the landlord is still responsible to see that it is paid. If it is not, the Borough may place a lien on the property and institute other collection procedures against the property owner.

Property Maintenance: Maintaining a residential property in a safe and livable condition is the responsibility of every property owner. This responsibility is shared when there are tenants renting the property from a landlord. The lease usually specifies what the tenant is responsible to take care of. The Borough has enacted in the International Property Maintenance Code (IPMC) as the standard to which all properties should meet. The Borough Code Enforcement Officer will be patrolling the streets of the Borough to find properties that are being neglected, and will notify the owner of significant violations visible from the street or sidewalk. However, some conditions may only be visible from a neighbor's property. We encourage all residents, whether they are owners or renters, to call the Borough office to alert us of unsafe or unsanitary conditions on their neighbor's property or within their rental units.

Business Certificates of Occupancy: The Borough Zoning Ordinance requires that every use of a building and property be compliant with the uses specified for each zoning district in the Borough. The Borough requests that any new or potential business owner fill out a Zoning Permit Application and contact the Codes Office before they sign a lease for a business or office space. The Zoning Officer will make sure that the proposed use is permitted for that location. A Building Code Official (BCO) may need to visit the site to determine that the facility or structure meets current accessibility requirements set forth in the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). The applicant may also need a building permit if any major modifications to the space are being planned. Once all the required inspections are completed satisfactorily the BCO will issue the Certificate of Occupancy. 🌞

- 3 West Shore Meals on Wheels is available to Lemoyne residents. This organization delivers hot, nutritious meals on weekdays during the mid-morning hours to those who are unable to prepare meals for themselves. If you or someone you know could benefit from this service, please call them at **717-737-3924**.

So as we say "so long" to summer and prepare for the winter, please keep in mind, the cold weather doesn't freeze the friendly community spirit that makes Lemoyne such a special place to live. So stay warm, stay happy, and remember to help your neighbor do the same. ☀️

Zoning and Ordinance

Over the last 6 years Borough council has worked hard to come up with a Rental Property Inspection program. At the September Council meeting Borough Council passed a rental inspection program that I believe is fair to the landlords and a way to make sure that those residents who need our help the most are able to live in an environment that is safe for their families. As part of the ordinance landlords will be required to register their all their rental units with the Borough office. This process will begin January 1st and must be completed within 90 days. The initial inspections of rental units will then begin January 1st 2017 and continue through 2020. There is a pre-defined checklist of the items that will be inspected. After the initial inspection period rental units will then be inspected on a 4-year cycle based on the four voting precincts in the borough. A unique aspect of our inspection program is when it is your year for inspection all rental units in that precinct will be thrown in a hat and a random 10% of those properties will be inspected. If you pass an inspection with no violations you will be able to skip 2 cycles or 8 years.

I want to thank everyone involved in the process, especially past Chairperson of the Zoning and Ordinance Committee Lynda Stark who started this process and worked tirelessly to get this program enacted. We have taken the input from many of our stakeholders and feel we have now crafted an ordinance that will work to make Lemoyne a great place to live. It has been my pleasure to serve as chair of this committee and I look forward to continuing to serve the borough through this committee alongside my fellow committee members. 🌟

Administration Committee

The Administration Committee will be working through the fall on the Borough's budget for 2016 which begins on January 1, 2016. Two public meetings were held in September and one in October to discuss proposed expenditures for the General Fund, the Wastewater Treatment Plant and the Pool at Memorial Park.

The proposed budget will be finalized by the Administration Committee in October. The budget is to be presented to the public and Borough Council at its November 5th meeting, and voted on as final at the December 10th Council meeting. The proposed budget for all Borough operations totals approximately \$5.5 million.

The Committee has also been reviewing all staffing functions and rewriting job descriptions for the Front Office Customer Service Team which consists of: Borough Manager/ Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Office Manager/Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, Clerk and for the first time a full-time Codes Enforcement Officer. The emphasis for all staff is providing excellent customer service to all Lemoyne residents and property owners. 🌟

Community Development Committee

Another Summer has come and gone. Before we know it we will be seeing snowflakes coming down upon us! Which means Thanksgiving and Christmas will also be here before we know it. And at the Community Development Committee meetings we are still working on our projects for Lemoyne.

The Committee has moved forward on the project to hopefully bring to Lemoyne its first mural. A grant of \$2500 from the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts was awarded to the Borough in September to provide small stipends for mural artists to present conceptual renderings of the theme: "Travel Pathways through Lemoyne's History". The initial proposed location for the 6-panel mural is the wall of the Lemoyne exit ramp off I-83. We are working with PennDOT to have this imaginative art project in a great location! A community committee will be appointed to work under the Community Development Committee to select the final rendering for the mural and the artist chosen will transfer the design onto specialized cloth in sections. Each section will be painted by volunteers from the community – young and old alike at special painting workshops. Each section will be affixed to the wall with special adhesives and then coated with a special anti-graffiti coating. This will be a great community project for which additional funding will be sought for the materials and paint necessary to complete it.

We also are close to agreement with a property owner for one of the new Green Bus Shelters. Hopefully when we get the first one installed we will have other businesses that will be willing to have one installed on their properties.

At our September Borough Council Meeting, we approved the participation of Borough Manager Robert Ihlein on a team with the West Shore School District and the Cumberland County staff to help make the former Lemoyne Middle School more marketable and help achieve community and economic development goals. The Borough Planning Commission will be examining the zoning status of the middle school property.

I have always enjoyed writing my article for the news letter. This time it was a little difficult for me. I just could not come up with the words. I believe it is because this is the last article from me as my four year term on Borough Council will end in December. I have enjoyed being behind the scenes and learning about Lemoyne "The Little Town That Has It All" 🌞

WINTER MAINTENANCE OF BOROUGH STREETS

We will be pretreating the streets with salt brine when we can. We will also salt the streets as needed. Residents should park their cars in their driveways if possible. It is almost impossible for the equipment operators not to plow some snow into the driveways. This is not done deliberately, but the department has the responsibility to clear the streets.

Property owners and residents are reminded to clear their sidewalks as soon as possible after the snow stops. Please do not throw the snow and ice back on the streets. Sewer Update

COUNCIL ADOPTS NEW SEWER RATES

In September, Council voted to adopt new Sewer Rates which will be implemented in November 2015. The rates are listed BELOW (TO THE SIDE OF) this article. These rate changes are the result of months of work with commercial customers, multifamily unit owners and residents who had concerns about the rates previously set by Council. While everyone wants the rates to decrease, some of the customers were sharing concerns with the rates which potentially prevented them from continuing to live in or run their business in the Borough. We had discussions every month at the Sewer Committee meetings and we were able to develop a rate system that resolved the greatest concerns. We appreciate everyone who helped and offered input as the discussion continued.

During September and October meetings were held to plan for the 2016 Sewer Fund Budget. The revenue must cover the operating expenses and debt service of the entire sewer system. The final construction costs for the plant upgrade were not available at the time this was written. We are planning to host an open house at the plant for anyone who wants to see the new system, and we will advertise this when a date has been chosen. We look forward to this event and having our staff show you the plant operation. Thank you again to everyone for your input and patience as we work through these required changes to make the plant meet modern pollution control regulations. 🌞

Know Your Sewer

I would like to inform our residents and business owners on the proper procedure for reporting a sewer backup. If you are experiencing sewage backing up into the basement of your home or business you MUST immediately contact Lemoyne Borough's Sewer Department at 717-763-7575. If staff is not able to answer your call, contact me directly at 717-574-7153. When reporting a sewer backup we will need the following information: Name, Address, Contact Number and the nature of the backup. PLEASE, do not contact a plumber before the problem is investigated by Sewer Department staff. Following this procedure can save us all time and money.

The second item I would like to address is sewer gas odor within your home or place of business. This is not only a foul/offensive odor, it can be detrimental to your health. If sewer gas/odor is ever detected within your home or place of business, proper ventilation is a must. Open doors, windows and run exhaust fans. The problem is most likely within your plumbing waste traps. At times the water inside them will dry out, which allows gases to escape into the building. Simply flush all toilets, momentarily turn on all sinks, showers, etc. Don't forget slop sinks or floor drains in the basement. These steps should solve your problem. If not, it is very possible that your sewer vent pipe has an obstruction. This should be cleared by a professional because it must be done from the roof of most structures.

I have one more important reminder about what you flush down your toilet. Please do not flush any feminine products or their applicators or sanitary or baby wipes. Even though it states that these products are flushable on the packaging, they are not nearly as biodegradable as standard toilet tissue. They have adverse effects on our collection and treatment systems. Everyone's cooperation on this matter would be deeply appreciated. 🌞

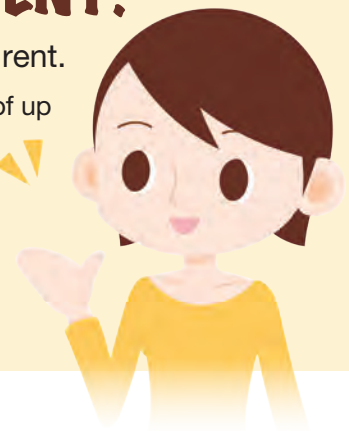
