# Sewer Committee

## THINK BEFORE YOU POUR

Hello neighbors! My name is Dan Green. I am one of your newly elected council members. Prior to joining council, I served (and continue to serve) on the board of the Lemoyne Municipal Authority (LMA). In my time involved in the borough's waste water treatment operations, I've benefited greatly from the expertise provided by the tremendous staff at the plant and vast knowledge and experience from members of the LMA. In the coming months, we expect the plant project will reach final completion and we plan on having the council, LMA, and residents of the borough decide the best way to maximize the newly redesigned plant that many in the borough have worked so hard to complete.

In the meantime, I'd like to provide you with a friendly reminder about a few "do's and don'ts" when it comes to liquid waste disposal in your home. While it may seem like commonsense, it bears reminding that what we flush or send down the drain makes the quick trip to our waste water treatment plant for treatment and then is discharged into the Susquehanna. While our plant and collection system is designed to handle a variety of stresses, it is primarily suited to handle biological solid wastes. So as a refresher, DO NOT flush or pour the following products down the drain: cleaners, beauty products, medicine, auto fluids, paint, lawn care products, grease, diapers, latex products, feminine hygiene products (including applicators), motor oil), photographic chemicals, sanitary/baby wipes and kitty litter.

# Streets Committee

## MARKET STREET CROSSWALKS

Phase I Streetscape Project built in 2010, contained 11 brick crosswalks. Most of them on Market Street are in poor condition. We have not forgotten about these and we want these fixed as much as you do. Our Solicitor advises if we pay to have the crosswalks replaced, then we will know the exact amount of compensation to pursue. Council may move forward with this over the summer.

## PAVEMENT MARKINGS

Thermoplastic pavement markings for crosswalks and stop bars, due to cost factor, are on a five year replacement cycle. Total footage was obtained, then that number was divided by five. That amount will be budgeted and replaced each year in

rotation. The same will be done with yellow paint and curbing; however, this will be done on a three year cycle by sections of the Borough.

## ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

The Municipal Liquid Fuels Program allows us to submit applications yearly for money to improve our streets. The amount we get is based on population and total miles of streets. This year's street paving schedule can be found under the Maintenance Department report. Thank you to our staff for keeping up with this every year. ☀️

## Managing Your Summer Sewer Bills

The Borough has included a water consumption component in the sewer bills since 2010. Monthly water consumption data is obtained from PA American Water Company and is used to determine your sewer bill. During warmer weather a number of customers increase their water consumption, primarily for outdoor uses. Some outdoor uses, such as filling swimming pools and irrigating lawns and gardens, can consume a great deal of water. This can lead to significantly higher sewer bills if the water comes through your water meter. Some suggestions for managing your summer sewer bills are: a) if you need to fill a swimming pool use a trucked-in source of water; b) use water captured in rain barrels to water your gardens; c) use drought-tolerant grass seed that requires less watering for your new lawn. ## MS-4 and You

As an operator of Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4s), the Borough of Lemoyne is responsible for the development and implementation of stormwater management plans.

The stormwater requirement of the federal Clean Water Act (CWA) are administered under the PA MS4 Program.

### WHAT IS MS4?

Under the 1987 Clean Water Act Amendments, the U.S. EPA developed stormwater regulations to address stormwater that might impact water quality. The CWA prohibits the discharge of pollutants into waterways without the appropriate permits. These regulations were set up depending upon the US Census population data. The stormwater regulation phase affects about 1,000 municipalities in Pennsylvania. Those municipalities that are located within and "urbanized area" as defined by the 2010 Census were required to apply for a National Pollutant Discharge Eliminations System (NPDES) permit to discharge stormwater from their municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4).

### WHAT IS STORMWATER?

Stormwater is water from precipitation that flows across the ground and pavement when it rains or when snow and ice melt. The water seeps into the ground or drains into storm sewer systems with inlets and pipes that directly connect to local waterways. Stormwater becomes a problem when it picks up pollutants such as sediment, oil, grease, metals and coolants from vehicles.

Lemoyne is required to incorporate the following six elements (Minimum Control Measures-MCSs) into its storm water management programs: 1) public education and outreach, 2) public involvement and participation, 3) illicit discharge detection and elimination, 4) construction site runoff control, 5) post-construction stormwater management in new development and redevelopment, 6) pollution prevention and good housekeeping for municipal operation and maintenance.

Implementation of stormwater management efforts in Pennsylvania occurs at the community level because individual municipalities are ultimately responsible for adopting zoning ordinances, subdivision and land development regulations, and other ordinances that keep their locality's runoff under control.

Each Lemoyne citizen has a role in stormwater management. Planting trees and establishing rain gardens in their yards can help. The idea is to slow down the stormwater so it will seep into the ground. The following are some measures which can be taken to reduce the flow of contaminated stormwater.

- Maintain your car and always recycle used motor oil
- Never dump motor oil, antifreeze, transmission fluid or other engine fluids into road gutter, down the storm drain or catch basin, onto the ground, or into a ditch.
- Use fertilizers sparingly.
- Consider using organic fertilizers.
- Never fertilize before a rain storm.
- Let your grass clippings lay. Don't bag the grass. Use a mulching lawn mower.
- Pick up your animal waste. When is left on the ground,

rainwater or melting snow washes the pet waste into our storm drains or directly into our local creeks. The disease causing bacteria found in pet waste eventually flows from local waterways into the Chesapeake Bay. This promotes excessive aquatic plant growth that can choke waterways and promote algae blooms.

- Wash your car on gravel, grass or other permeable surface, so the ground can filter the water naturally. When you are done empty your bucket of soapy water down the sink, not the street.
- Plant a tree.
- Create a rain garden on your property.
- During winter time, reduce salt and other chemicals by adding sand for traction.
- Use rain barrels.

With your help, Lemoyne can reduce the flow of contaminated stormwater into the streams and river. If you see or suspect contaminants flowing down a street or into a storm drain, call the Borough Office immediately at 717-737-6843 from 8:00AM to 4:00PM. Otherwise, dial 911 to report a pollution event.

The Borough will be conducting educational activities at public events during the summer and fall. Check the Borough website for more information.

# A Note from the Cumberland County Vector Control Office

It is never too early to start cleaning up properties to reduce mosquito breeding areas. Gutters, birdbaths, toys, flower pots, corrugated pipes, and tire ruts can all produce hundreds of mosquitoes in a very short time. Furthermore, mosquitoes can fly a mile from where they hatched searching for a blood meal; making mosquito management a COMMUNITY effort. Residents should identify these mosquito breeding habitats on their property — **remove** the water source or **apply a control product** — to keep their whole neighborhood healthy.

The West Nile Virus Control Program’s objective is to reduce expected morbidity and mortality, health care costs, and the

financial impact that WNV outbreaks would have upon Commonwealth industries. The program is funded and directed by the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and implemented through the County’s Vector Control office, which monitors this mosquito-borne



disease at over 150 sites. Waters known to breed mosquitoes are treated with naturally occurring bacteria to reduce mosquito populations before they can ever bite someone. When an adult control spray is necessary, information is posted on the County’s website 48 hours prior to treatment. You can sign up for “**Notify Me**” emails to stay informed on these events.
