Sewer Committee

As you may know, preliminary discussions have taken place surrounding a possible sale of the Lemoyne Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) to an Investor Owned Utility (IOU). Talks are in the early stages, and Borough Council has not made any decisions at this point about whether to move forward with a sale. As I write this in early September, Council is directing its solicitor to assist in the legal services of preparing a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) and a Request for Proposal (RFP) for a potential sale of the WWTP.

Lemoyne's new WWTP serves over 2,200 customers throughout the Borough. Our major pump stations have recently been refurbished, the plant has excess capacity, and we are following our National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit. Roughly 20 miles of pipe run through town as part of the collection system. While some sections of the collection system have been replaced over the years, others are still the original terracotta pipe.

What does this all mean? Our Borough is in the envious position of having a plant and collection system that can remain under public operation without any major obstacles. Our new plant can run more efficiently and with more automation than its predecessor. Every collection system requires scheduled maintenance. Is Lemoyne in the best position to handle these

upgrades ourselves? Would we be better off selling the asset and turning over operations and rate control to an IOU? These are questions that Council is currently grappling with.

Over the next few months Council will be examining all potential options when it comes to the WWTP. There are pros and cons to any decision that will be made. The WWTP belongs to every citizen of our town, and decisions regarding its future should be done as a community. Please feel free to share your thoughts with me and all of Lemoyne's elected leadership. I look forward to hearing your input. ☀️

Ordinance & Zoning Committee

How's it possible that summer is already over? Where did all that time go? It feels like we just celebrated Memorial Day.

It's been a busy few months in the Ordinance & Zoning world. Seems the minute we completed a project, two or three more popped up. Regretfully, we have not yet completed work on a Responsible Pet Owner ordinance, but thankfully the enactment of "Libre's Law" put several new protections and mandates in place. We plan to pick this issue up again in the coming months.

Since we are heading into fall and winter it seems like a good time for a reminder that the Borough does have a snow removal ordinance requiring sidewalks to be cleared within ten daylight hours after a snow or ice storm event. Please keep in mind that cleared pathways should be at least 36 inches wide, and no snow, slush, or ice should be placed or piled in a gutter or cartway of any street. For everyone's safety please be considerate and comply with the ordinance.

One new quality of life measure we have put in place is an expedited code complaint referral format. The West Shore Police

Department has been provided with brief, pre-formatted code referral forms that will allow Officers to channel applicable citizen complaints directly to the Codes Enforcement Officer. Additionally, the Borough has purchased code enforcement tracking software. One of the components of this new software will be to track citizen complaint issues. Hopefully, this will help prevent complaints from "falling through the cracks."

I would be remiss if I didn't take this opportunity to express my sincere appreciation to all the folks who have taken the time to come to the meetings, get involved in the issues, and offer their voices to help make Lemoyne the best it can be. At a time when we hear and see so many negative examples of offensive and inflammatory public discourse being represented as "free speech," it is reassuring to witness true CIVILITY in action. We have seen how people can work together in Lemoyne and, as I write this, I am overwhelmed by the selfless, dedicated acts of so very many people in the devastation we are seeing in the wake of recent hurricanes. WE WILL ALWAYS BE BETTER TOGETHER!

As Ben Franklin said, "be civil to all, sociable to many, familiar with a few, friend to one and enemy to none." 🌞

Stormwater—What can I do?

One of the questions I receive as I discuss stormwater with the citizens of Lemoyne is, “MS4 stormwater sounds like such a big problem, what can I do?” This is a valid question and each of us doing our part can help make sure we have clean safe water for our family and neighbors.

To help ensure we all have clean quality water to drink and enjoy, take the following steps:

- Never dump anything down a storm drain
- Compost yard waste
- Plant native grasses in bare spots in your yard, set mowers at 3 inches to help retain turf density
- Use fertilizers sparingly, never exceed the product’s application rates
- Sweep driveways, sidewalks and roads (rather than washing them with water)
- Avoid using pesticides
- Direct downspouts to lawns and away from paved areas
- Wash your vehicle at the car wash instead of in your driveway
- Conduct routine maintenance on your vehicle, check for fluid leaks, recycle motor oil
- Clean up after your pet to minimize bacteria reaching our waterways

Each of us doing our part will help prevent pollutants from discharging into surface waters, rivers, streams, lakes, ponds and wetlands.

Runoff from rain or snow melt that cannot be absorbed into the ground has the ability to carry pollutants such as oils, soil/ sediment, chemicals and lawn fertilizers directly to our surface waters. Clean and safe water for you, your family, and your neighbors to enjoy and use is a responsibility each of us must strive to achieve. With your support, the goal of clean and safe water for all can be achieved. Thank you for doing your part. 🌞

As we begin to move out of the long summer days and evenings and into the cooler shorter days of fall/winter, the West Shore Regional Police Department hopes everyone had wonderful summer. With that in mind, we offer the following reminders:

- Street Cleaning is now being done on a daily basis until the end of the year. Make sure to take note of the day for your specific street in order to avoid receiving a ticket.
- Trick-or-Treat is scheduled for Tuesday, October 31, 2017. Please stay alert to your surroundings and be careful when crossing the streets. There will be police officers out distributing treats to the children again this year. Make sure to say hello and get your treat!
- Please take the time to find out if you reside along a Snow Emergency Route. If you are in one of those areas, be sure to pay special attention to local media in the event the Mayor would declare a Snow Emergency requiring all vehicles be removed from the street. 2017 FALL STREET CLEANING

Weekly street cleaning has begun, and leaf collection will start on October 16th and run through December 8th. Please do not put leaves out before October 16th as the sweeper is not capable of collecting them and will be forced to go around them.

WINTER STREET/SIDEWALK MAINTENANCE

The Borough's Maintenance Department is prepared for the upcoming snow and ice season! The most heavily traveled roads will be cleared first, but we will get to all Borough streets as quickly as we can. Streets will be pre-treated with salt brine when possible and salted as needed. It is almost impossible for equipment operators not to plow some snow back into driveways. To help alleviate the impact of plows passing your home, place the snow to the right of your driveway (standing with your back facing your house). This will reduce the amount of snow plowed back into the drive area. Residents are asked to park their cars in driveways during winter weather events whenever possible. Please remember that snow removal operations are most often performed under emergency conditions. Our drivers often endure extended work hours to provide safe and effective snow removal from our streets.

For the safety of the general public, property owners and residents are reminded to clear sidewalks as soon as possible after the storm has ended. Please do not throw snow and ice back on the streets.

CHRISTMAS TREE COLLECTION

Christmas trees will be collected again this year by the solid waste/recycling contractor. Please be sure to remove all tree stands, decorations, and lights before placing trees at the normal trash pickup area.

Please do not contact a plumber before the problem is investigated by Sewer Department staff. Following this procedure may save us all time and money.
- One other important reminder: please avoid flushing feminine products/applicators, sanitary wipes, baby wipes, etc. down toilets. Toilet tissue is the only product that is readily biodegradable. These other items have an adverse effect on our collection system and treatment plant facility, and could also affect your individual sewer lateral. Your cooperation on this matter is most appreciated. ☀️

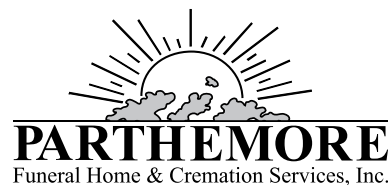

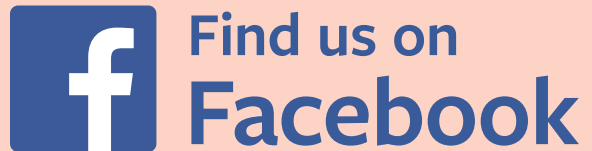
