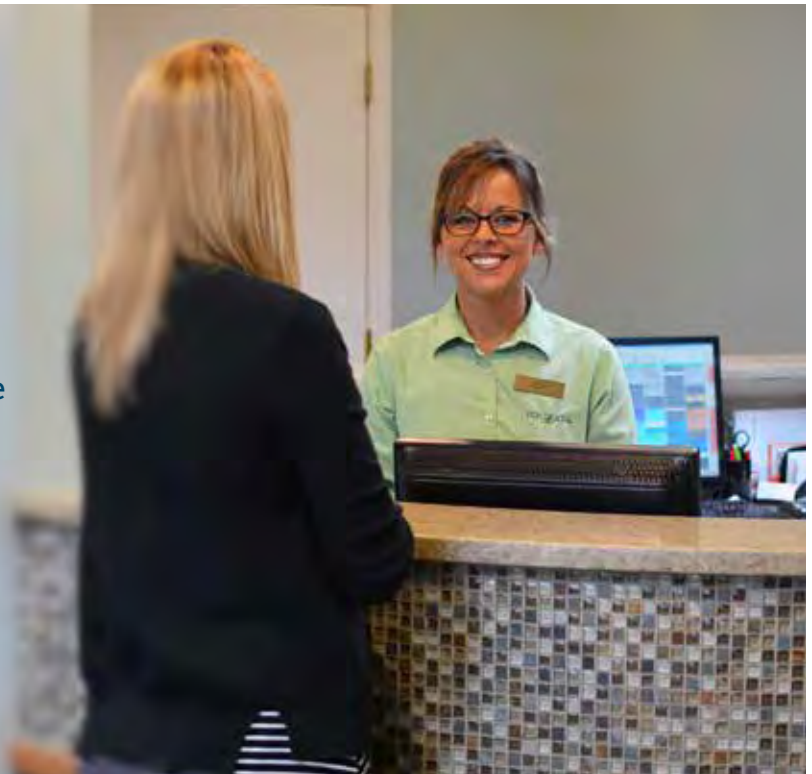

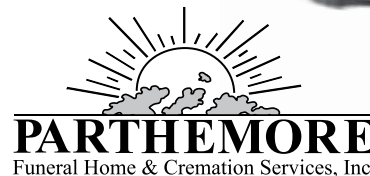
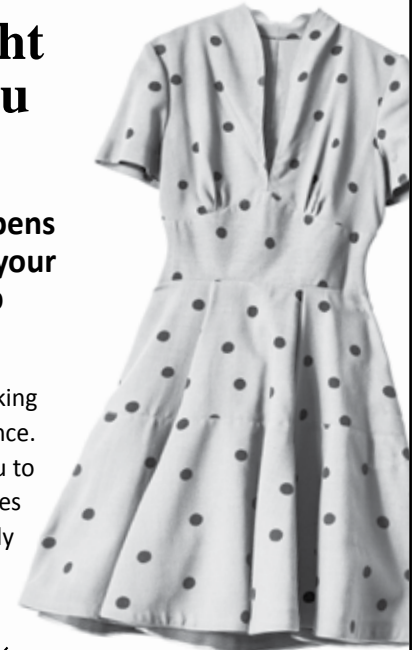

With this year's budget Council also approved the addition of a part-time seasonal parks worker. Maintenance Department

Street cleaning began on April 9th and runs through September 14th. Please make sure to check the signs on your side of the street in your block for the correct day. This year there will be two new streets added to the sweeping route—State Street and North Seventh Street. Be sure to move your car on street sweeping days to avoid receiving a parking ticket.

The street paving project this year will consist of North 12th Street from Market Street to Indiana Avenue. We will be using a milled-in place method for the rougher base coat. After this layer settles (about four weeks), the top coat will be installed. During this time your patience is appreciated. The top coat will follow as soon as possible returning the road to the smooth surface you would expect. We hope to schedule the work during night-time hours to avoid major disruptions to traffic flow.

The Maintenance Department will also be planting additional Shade Trees throughout the Borough in the spring. If you are interested in receiving a new tree in front of your property please stop by the office and fill out a Shade Tree Application.

Sewer Department

SEWER MAIN FLUSHING

Each year the Borough's Sewer Department works at flushing the sewer mains as part of routine maintenance as well as proactive preparation for annual paving projects. While backups or disturbances such as noise from drains or splashing of toilet water do not always happen, it can occur during periods of flushing. It is important for residents to be aware that under the Pennsylvania Governmental Immunity Statute, the Borough has limited legal responsibility for sewer backups. Residents are advised to contact their homeowners or commercial insurance

agent to determine if their policy includes sewer or water backups.

SEWER BACKUP PROCEDURES

In the event of a sewer backup or blockage at your residence or business you should immediately contact the **Lemoyne Borough Sewer Department at (717) 763-7575**. If staff is not available to answer your call, contact the Collection System Supervisor, **Tim Travitz at (717) 574-7153**. When reporting a sewer backup we will need the following information: name, address, contact information and nature of the backup. Do not contact a plumber before the problem is investigated by Sewer Department staff. Following this procedure can save us all time and money. 🌞

Codes, Zoning and Ordinance Department

Well, perhaps by the time you read this, winter will have finally ended and warmer days will be the norm. There have been gigantic leaps taken and major progress made by Borough Council and Administration in 2017 to make the Codes, Zoning and Ordinance Department professional and user friendly. Codification of our ordinances will soon be complete making it possible to review all of the Borough's ordinances on line in an easy to use format. No more jumble of old papers.

The Codes and Zoning Department has now entered the 21st century! No longer are permits, inspections and documents kept in file folders. Council authorized the purchase of iWorQ, a report managing system that allows the staff to produce, maintain and store all of our documents digitally. Permits and permit payments will be available online. An added feature of the iWorQ system is an app that allows citizens to send their concerns to the Borough's different departments from a phone or mobile device where they will be documented, routed and tracked.

Street improvement projects in 2019 and 2020 include the repaving of Hummel Avenue and South Third Street. The project will include the road surface, curbing, and possibly even sidewalks. More on this project will be forthcoming at Council meetings and in future newsletters.

Finally, there has been interest in a number of locations in Lemoyne that could bring new businesses and residential opportunities. These proposed developments will not only increase the tax revenue for the Borough but will bring jobs and new homeownership potentials. Unlike many suburban townships Lemoyne has limited opportunities for land development projects. We need to make the right and fiscally responsible choices.

It's all about what's right for the Borough, its businesses, and its residents. Lemoyne is moving forward! Lemoyne is improving! Let's keep the progress going. 🌞




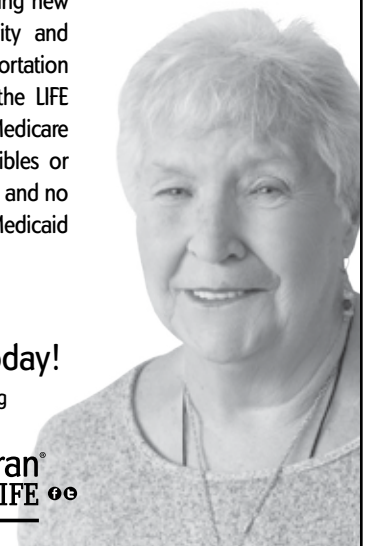

Pathway to our Parks

As a newly elected Lemoyne Borough Councilmember, I am sincerely grateful to those of you who voted for me. I hope to make decisions for the greater good of Lemoyne, and to work towards the betterment of our town. As a member of the Community Development/Parks & Recreation Committee, I am excited to start on a project that I am very passionate about; that is, to develop a health and wellness walking/jogging/biking path throughout Lemoyne. Utility Service Partners Service Contract Agreement

Recently, you may have received a letter from Utility Service Partners (USP). In the fall of 2017, after healthy deliberation and research, Lemoyne entered into an agreement with USP allowing the company to offer water, sewer, and inside plumbing service contracts to Borough residents. USP has been vetted and selected by the National League of Cities (NLC), the nation's oldest and largest municipal advocacy organization. These service contracts are completely optional for Borough residents. Furthermore, nothing will prohibit anyone from selecting another provider if they so choose.

One of the draws of the USP program is that the contractors used in the NLC Service Line Warranty Program are local to each community. Additionally, the rates and coverage proposed under the service contract appear to be highly competitive when compared with existing service plans we had surveyed.

As Chairman of the Sewer Committee and a member of the Lemoyne Municipal Authority, I have seen the large bills that residents can be hit with if their laterals collapse, or a service line disconnects. Purchasing some sort of protection may prove to be a smart decision. However, I would encourage people to check with their insurance agent and look at their existing homeowner's policy to see exactly what type of coverage they may already have. While folks may not always prepare for emergency home repairs, that does not prevent these unexpected occurrences.

Again, participation in USP's NLC Service Line Warranty Program is completely voluntary. As always make the decision that is right for you and your family. I look forward to seeing you around town this spring. May all of Lemoyne enjoy sturdy laterals and fast flowing potable water! ☀️

Maple Street Park Improvements Planned

As part of the 2018 budget, Council allocated \$20,000 for new playground equipment at Maple Street Park. The current play set has been there longer than the equipment in any of our other parks and is badly in need of an upgrade. Borough staff is

researching play sets that would fit in that space and will begin the replacement project once the ball fields, the pool, and our other parks are prepped and ready for the season.

Discussions are currently underway on the type of ground cover to use at Maple Street Park to complement the new playground equipment. Wood carpet has been the standard at all our parks, but the thought is to switch to something requiring less maintenance like rubber carpet or, budget permitting, a rubber compound mat system. Either way, rest assured that Borough Council is dedicated to making all of our parks places that the community can be proud of. Be sure to keep an eye out as we continue to improve and upgrade the parks throughout the Borough! 🌞

Yard Waste Collection Program Expanded

Part of the new contract with Penn Waste calls for yard waste to be collected on the third Saturday of each month from April to October. Yard Waste is defined as garden residue, shrubbery, tree trimmings and similar materials no longer than six feet in length and six inches in diameter (excluding grass clippings which should be mulched or disposed of with solid waste, and leaves that are collected by vacuum). To participate in the program, yard waste should be placed in biodegradable paper bags or bundled and set out at your regular collection site. 🌞
