One of the projects that we are undertaking is an Early Intervention Program. This is somewhat of a misnomer though. In fact, legislation has recently been introduced to change the name to the "Strategic Management Planning Program."

We are working with the nonprofit Pennsylvania Economy League to develop the Plan. Fortunately, the Borough received a grant from the PA Department of Community and Economic Development to cover approximately two-thirds of the cost.

The goals of this program are to develop a short- and long-term financial strategy, implement a "best practices" approach to management, consider potential revenue streams, establish cost-effective asset management, explore cost sharing inter-municipal opportunities, and analyze health and liability insurance, retirement plans and collective bargaining agreements.

It is a very comprehensive review of all aspects of LemoynE's current financial and operational practices in order to maximize efficiencies, opportunities and cost containment.

Stay tuned for a public meeting this summer to review the Early Intervention Program process and findings.

And mark your calendars for the 12th Annual Concert at Negley Park when we welcome the Harrisburg Symphony Orchestra to our Borough! The date this year is July 3rd and we will again feature a variety of artists, food and beverage vendors and pre-concert music. Join us for this beautiful evening under the stars!

You Want Me to Put the Road on a Diet?

When someone suggested a road diet for the Bottleneck I didn't know you could put a road on a diet, but apparently, you can. Look it up! I did and this is what I learned. Simply put, a "road diet" is reconfiguring an existing roadway to improve safety or provide space for other modes of travel. For example, a two-way, four-lane road might be reduced to one travel lane in each direction to free up space to widen sidewalks, add bicycle lanes, or make other improvements.

If you've recently traveled on Front Street in Harrisburg, you may have noticed that three lanes of traffic have been reduced to two with a bicycle path. Since the reconfiguration, I found it easier to concentrate on my driving. I also noticed that people are driving more gently and carefully, now that there is more space to maneuver and bicycles have a safer path to travel.

Anyone who has driven the Bottleneck is well aware of the traffic and congestion in the area, especially during rush hours. The lanes are very close together and the curves around the bridge abutments make visibility very difficult and dangerous. Over 100 years ago the Bottleneck served its purpose well providing a thoroughfare to and from LemoynE. Today that section of road is very dangerous and congested with over 17,500 automobiles traveling it every day. As responsible citizens, we need to take a look at what can be done to fix this.

In March, Borough Council heard a presentation from the Tri-County Regional Planning Commission on what might be done to put our Bottleneck on a road diet. Council found the idea very interesting and decided it deserved additional research. You can expect more discussion as we move forward. This is a perfect time for you to be a part of it.

The Volunteer Fire Fighter Crisis is National, but Also Local

Of the firefighters in the United States, 70% are volunteers, and those numbers have been going down steadily for years. No state illustrates this decline more than Pennsylvania. In the 1970s, Pennsylvania had around 300,000 volunteer firefighters. Those numbers plummeted to just 38,000 over the past 40 years. Our state has the highest number of volunteer firefighters in the country with 90% of its departments being volunteer. Departments face an uphill struggle and some states, including ours, are investigating ways to bolster the volunteer force and reduce costs to departments (U.S. Fire Administration, www.usfa.fema.gov).

The West Shore Bureau of Fire protects the Boroughs of Lemoyne and Wormleysburg, pulling volunteers from within and from surrounding communities. Financial stability is a vital part of a volunteer fire department's existence, but there is much more to operating a 24/7/365 emergency services organization. The selfless act of volunteering time to the safety of your community can be very rewarding. There are many opportunities within our organization to apply your talents. A volunteer firefighter can be trained to put out fires, support fire ground operations, or perform vehicle rescue. Sewer Department

PROPER FOG DISPOSAL

FOG (Fats, Oils and Grease) is found in meat, fish, butter, cooking oil, mayonnaise, gravies, sauces and food scraps. When FOG enters our sewer system, it can clog pipes and cause backups. If not handled properly, FOG can solidify and stick to the sides of kitchen drains and sewer pipes. Over time, buildup of FOG can plug pipes and cause sewer back-ups in your home or business. These buildups can also cause major operational problems in the public sewer system and can back sewage into our streams and rivers. To help prevent FOG:

- Don't pour oil, grease or fats down the drain
- Minimize use of your garbage disposal—put food scraps in the trash
- Use paper towels to soak up grease after frying and throw in trash

SEWER BACKUP PROCEDURES

In the event of a sewer backup or blockage at your residence or business you should immediately contact the Lemoyne Borough Sewer Department at (717) 763-7575. If staff is not available to answer your call, contact the Collection System Supervisor, Tim Travitz at (717) 574-7153. When reporting a sewer backup we will need your name, address, contact information and nature of the backup. Do not contact a plumber before the problem is investigated by Sewer Department staff. Following this procedure can save us all time and money. ☀️

Maintenance Department

Thanks to the knowledge and years of experience of the Borough's Maintenance crew we made it through the 41 total inches of snow that fell on Lemoyne since then. Other Maintenance Department projects include:

- Once the weather broke we spent some time cleaning the streets by sweeping up the tons of anti-skid that were spread on the roadways over the winter. Localized street cleaning has begun with our new street sweeper.
- The 2019 street paving season will begin shortly with a focus on the 100 and 200 blocks of Hummel Avenue and a small section of Mulberry Street. Penn DOT plans to pave Hummel Avenue from Third Street to the Borough line in 2020.
- The Borough's parks are open and available for use. Please help us maintain our parks by curbing your dog and putting trash in the proper receptacle. Be sure to check out the new playground equipment at Maple Street Park and try your hand on the pickleball court at Negley Park.
- The Maintenance Department will be planting a limited number of shade trees throughout the Borough this spring. If you are interested in a new tree in front of your property, please stop by the office and complete an application form. We wish everyone an enjoyable and safe summer. ☀️

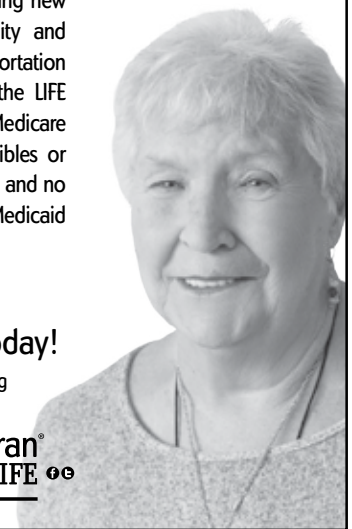

Bike Share Rentals Coming to Lemoyne!

Bicycling reduces traffic, pollution, vehicle costs, and stress levels. It is a convenient, cost effective, and eco-friendly form of transportation that improves your health and strengthens our community. . . and what a great way to enjoy the spring sunshine!

The Harrisburg Bike Share has partnered with Zagster to make recreation and commuting on bicycles more accessible for adults ages 18 and older. They currently have 11 bicycle rental locations in Harrisburg. You can purchase an annual membership for \$25 that allows free 2-hour trips. If you prefer you can also rent for \$2 per hour without purchasing a membership.

Bikes are rented and unlocked in a matter of moments using a smart phone app and can be returned to any approved docking station. Many current cyclers enjoy riding to Negley Park, the West Shore Farmer's Market, and other destinations throughout our town.

Harrisburg Bike Share is looking to expand their services into Cumberland County this year, and I'm so excited to share that Lemoyne has been chosen as a site for this method of transportation! Rental stations should be installed by spring or early summer.

Participating in this venture also has a positive impact on local children. Proceeds from the Harrisburg Bike Share program help fund the Children in Schools Pennsylvania (CISPA), a nonprofit organization dedicated to reducing dropout rates by working with students to overcome challenges, improve their success levels in school, and prepare them for life. This organization helps over 50,000 children across the state, including children here in Central Pennsylvania!

You may also have heard about various codes/zoning issues recently proposed. All Borough residents and businesses can rest assured that all of these proposals/suggestions will be assessed objectively and within the legal parameters of existing zoning, codes regulations and Borough Ordinances. Borough officials are obligated to be constantly cognizant of the financial health of the Borough and, therefore, the financial obligations of our residents and businesses. ☀️

What is MS4?

The Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) is the system for collecting and guiding rainwater into retention basins, ditches, roadside inlets, underground pipes and storm drains. It is important to keep materials that can be composted such as grass, leaves, tanbark and animal waste from being discharged into storm sewers. If these materials get into the system, nitrogen and phosphorous levels are increased causing unwanted and uncontrolled growth of algae and aquatic weeds in our waterways. Sewage, soapy water, swimming pool water, oil, grease, and paint are also dangerous to the system.

Residents can help keep Lemoyne's MS4 system healthy by taking these steps:

1. Use a blower or rake to keep grass clippings in your yard rather than discharging them into the street.
2. Be cautious when using tanbark. During the process try to store tanbark in grassy areas instead of in driveways or on streets as rain could cause it to flow into the storm sewer system.
3. Dispose animal waste in a trash can.
4. Swimming pool water discharge (and other soapy waters) can be emptied onto your grass, but should not be drained directly into the system.

To report a discharge of any of these substances into the MS4 system, please call the Borough Office at 717-737-6843. ☀️

Sewer Billing System Gets an Upgrade

The Borough recently began a project to transition its sewer billing software to a new platform that can "talk" to its financial software. The new software allows inclusion of the new stormwater assessment fee on the bill while improving internal auditing controls, enhancing reporting capabilities, and eliminating double entries by administrative staff. The new system will benefit residents as well with more options increasing customer service. Starting with the April bills, you will be able to set-up online password-protected personal accounts to:

- Check the status of your account
- Make online payments with a credit card or via automatic bank withdrawal. Note—Customers with automatic bank withdrawal must visit the website (www.lemoynepa.com) to set up a new account with Xpress Bill Pay
- Replace paper billing with more environmentally friendly email bills

Penn Waste Updates

YARDWASTE REMINDER

Penn Waste will be collecting yard waste on the third Saturday of each month until October. Yard Waste includes garden residue, shrubbery, tree trimmings and similar materials no longer than 6' long and 6" in diameter (excluding grass clippings which should be mulched or disposed of with solid waste, and leaves that are collected by vacuum). Place yard waste in biodegradable paper bags or bundle and set out at your regular collection site.

RECYCLING NEWS.

The list of materials acceptable for recycling has changed! Aluminum and steel cans, glass bottles and jars, plastics (#1, #2 and #5 so long as the neck is smaller than the base), food and beverage cartons (milk, juice, soup), cardboard (corrugated and shipping boxes only), and newspaper are still okay to place in your recycling bin. All other paper, including cereal boxes and shredded paper, are not acceptable. For more information about what is and what's not recyclable, visit www.pennwaste.com and remember, when in doubt, throw it out.
